Rules and Regulations

SECTION 1 –INTRODUCTION

Background: The software for Intersectus was written in 2007 and originally offered only one student service – carpooling. It has been re-written to include another 2 services: student accommodation and secondhand book buying and selling. The aim of Intersectus is two fold. Firstly, to encourage tertiary education students to contribute to a sustainable future ie: recycle, reduce carbon emissions via sharing lifts and secondly to make student life easier by offering useful services. Intersectus is a free website.

SECTION 3 – HOW TO ENTER THE COMPETITION

WHO MAY ENTER

- i) The competition is open to full-time/part-time undergraduate/postgraduate students attending an Australian University or TAFE.
- ii) This is a single persons entry only.

SECTION 4 – SUBMITTING AN ENTRY

- i) Each student must have completed the registration form. A contact address, telephone and email address must also be provided in order that the competition organisers can contact students.
- ii) Prior to submission a registration code will be provided by the competition organisers. The purpose of this judging can be 'blind'.
- iii) This registration code must be on every piece of work.
- iv) The choice of typefaces, illustrations, etc. is free.
- v) The design must be assembled using digital imaging techniques, though all of the elements may not necessarily have a digital origin.
- vi) The design should be presented using a page make-up or illustration program.
- vii) Entries must be submitted as high-quality colour prints. These will be used for judging.
- viii) Digital files **MUST** also be submitted for publication.

IMPORTANT: Printed entries unaccompanied by a digital version supplied on disc will be disqualified.

SUBMISSION FORMATS

All entries must be printed in high-quality colour on A4 paper, and mounted on light card with the completed official registration code written on the back. For the digital version of the entry. Please ensure that the entries are clearly identified.

The digital files should be supplied as high-quality TIFFs or JPEGs and the disc should be clearly labelled with the registration code.

SECTION 5 – TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- i) All students are advised to retain a fully copy of their presentation for their own records as entries will not be returned. Intersectus is not responsible for lost or damage of presentation materials on route.
- ii) All contestants must agree that all material becomes the property of Intersectus, the client and the sponsor, for any use whatsoever and that no compensation for services will be made now or in the future.

SECTION 6 –

Cause for Disqualification

By entering the competition it is understood that all individuals have read and agreed to the Rules and Regulations governing the competition.

Any violation of the rules will result in disqualification. Such violations include:

- Plagiarism.
- Soliciting or accepting outside help
- Failure to submit presentation manual to Intersectus by the deadline (30th August, 2010).
- Failure to properly complete and sign , or to falsify information on an Official Registration Form.
- Failure to follow presentation guidelines.
- Incomplete entry.
- Inclusion of internal administrative and assessment forms with entries.

SECTION 7 – NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES

Notification of winners will be made by Saturday, 18th September, 2010.
